Vacation Bible School was held in July with 20 youngsters and adults participating. We sent 4 young people and 2 adults to UMARMY (United Methodist Action Reach Out by Youth) this summer in Elliot, Maine and are planning to return again this summer. Soup Sundays are held the third Sunday of each month and the funds raised are used to offset the cost of attendance. Our Methodist Youth Fellowship (MYF) continues to meet under the guidance of Alyssa Wood.

We welcomed Lee Wade as our new Music Director. Our Music program leads us in worship each week, offering choral music, instrumentals, and solos.

Twice a month a group gathers to read and discuss Spiritual. The Upper Room discussion group meets every Thursday morning and Regenerate meets Thursday Evenings for fellowship, music and discussions. Several Sunday morning Bible classes for adults were held as well.

A group of talented seamstresses work on Day for Girls projects. Twenty five kits have already been sent off and another twenty five will travel to Haiti in early 2018.

I am forever grateful to the work of the Men's Ministry who maintain the church building and grounds and to the many volunteers, especially Debbie Welch, who keep the church clean and functioning.

Our Church continued participation in Shelton Clergy Association with the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service, a Christmas Carol sing, Lenten Wednesday night services and Easter sunrise service. I look forward to many more ecumenical services with area churches in the coming year.

Our fund raising committee is endlessly busy. We have had Dining Under the Stars, Tag Sale, and of course, Lenten Fish Fry. While these and other events, add to a much needed cash flow, there is still a need to take from our savings fund ministry.

A new day care has opened, Mulberry Day Care and we hope for their success. As in any new business, it takes time to establish, so if you know of anyone in need of day care, let them know about Mulberry.

The handicapped bathroom was completed this year, thanks to volunteer workers and those who funded the project. Some of the funds came for a DimChex grant.

I am so grateful for the work of committee members, and all of you who work tirelessly for our church. May God Bless our church family.

Editor's Note: This is Pastor's report from the Charge Conference.

2017 FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The 2017 year opened with a projected budget deficit of over \$33,000. The budget was approved at the 2016 Charge Conference. Throughout the majority of 2017 we struggled with cash flow which required careful management of expenses. This struggle was lessened when the new the daycare tenant began paying rent. However, by the Fall, due to slow enrollment, the Trustees allowed the tenant to temporarily decrease the monthly payment by \$2600. This has negatively affected the cash flow situation.

At the end of November, we had an operating balance of \$607 with outstanding bills of \$18,184 including eight months of Apportionments. The Finance Committee agreed to request a loan from the Trustees to be able to pay our outstanding bills before the end of the year. The Trustees have been notified and will work with the Finance Committee to provide the needed funds at the end of the year.

The 2018 proposed operating budget is presented to the Charge Conference for discussion and approval. Please see attached. Expected income for 2018 is \$168,237 which is \$21,772 more than that of the 2017 budget, and almost exactly accounts for the anticipated income from the day care rental. Projected expenses for 2018 are \$189,638, approximately \$9,300 more than the previous year projection. This has left a projected deficit of \$21,401 for 2018 which is lower than last year's projected deficit. The rental income listed in the budget is not equal to our lease with the tenant, therefore, if our tenant gets on solid ground during the year, the rental income should be brought up to the lease requirements and would lessen the deficit.

As with 2017, the 2018 budget presents us with a great financial challenge. The income generated from our facility is an important part of meeting our financial needs, as are the fundraising events that take place throughout the year. The Finance Committee will again rely heavily on the Fundraising Committee to meet our financial commitments. While the 2016budget had an aggressive number of \$15,000 for fundraising net income, we have decreased that slightly to just under \$14,000 for 2018 which is equal to what we achieved in 2017. To meet this goal, it will again be imperative for <u>all</u> members of our congregation to be actively involved in <u>all</u> fundraising efforts with their time, their talent and their financial support.

In 2017, all work areas were diligent in managing their expenditures and the Finance Committee is very grateful for their cooperation. Work area expenses comprise a very small portion of our overall expenses. The chart on the next page is a percentage breakdown of the expense categories for the 2017 budget.




