Thank you to all who participated in, supported, and attended our many Lenten, Holy Week, and Easter worship service activities. We had a wonderful season of fellowship, spiritual growth, and worship in our church and in the wider community.

There were lots of opportunities to serve. Our people cooked meals, served as liturgist, decorated the sanctuary, led Sunday School, and did so much more. A good-sized group also came together for an interesting and insightful book study.

We also experienced year-over-year attendance growth. There were 60 people in attendance at Easter worship (53 last year) and 50 on Palm Sunday (49 last year). For the four weeks up to and including Palm Sunday, our average attendance was 49 (41 last year). We also know that there are people connecting through YouTube wherever they are, down the street or across the country. (Thank you, Sal, for your technical expertise and commitment!)

As we move through the season of Easter and approach Pentecost in early June, let's be thinking and praying about how we can continue to show Christian love to our community through our service. Christ's resurrection was certainly a historical event, but it is also the time for us to step forward anew each year, recommitted to loving God and neighbor, showing the world that the Church rises to new life in response to our Risen Savior's grace.
