CROP Hunger Walk: May 4

The 51st Annual Bridgeport Area CROP Walk will be held on Sunday May 4th from 1:30 to 4:00 beginning and ending at the United Congregational Church, 2200 North Avenue in Bridgeport.

25% of the funds raised will go to help local hunger related programs including the Valley Food Bank at Spooner House. The other 75% will support programs of Church World Service including several in partnership with UMCOR, the United Methodist Committee on Relief.

Last year the Bridgeport CROP Walk raised over \$31,000 with our congregation contributing almost \$2000.
